

<b>Campus Planning and Finance Council (CPFC) Charges for 2006-07</b>
---

Dennis Simpson is the Faculty Senate Executive Board's liaison on the Campus Planning and Finance Council this year. The Executive Board charges the CPFC to consider, as a committee of the whole or through the appropriate sub-committee or task force, the following issues:

**1. Campus Planning and Student Recruitment**

Cultivate the role between campus planning and the long term goal of student recruitment and retention.

**2. West Campus and Miller Plaza**

Create a policy for proposed development and use of West Michigan Corridor and Miller Plaza.

**3. Budget**

CPFC should keep the faculty apprised of important developments with the University budget. These specifically include data and discussion in terms understandable to the faculty on: (1) priorities for spending, (2) University financial obligations for funding and resources, and (3) allocation of resources and rationale.

**4. Signs, Landscape, and Sculpture Committee**

Develop policies and guidelines related to signs, landscape, and sculpture arts. Work toward developing policies and procedures involving all landscapes on campus.

**5. Transportation Committee – Transportation and Parking**

Look into the situation of reduced bus service between the two campuses. Also, how was the change in the parking pass policy implemented without Senate involvement?

**6. East Campus**

Work with student and community (Friends of East Campus) groups to propose alternative plans for use and development of East Campus. In addition, work with the senior vice president for advancement and legislative affairs to communicate with the WMU community regarding the activities of Friends of WMU.

**NOTE:**

- The Campus Planning and Finance Council is free to determine the specifics of how to address these charges and other tasks it wishes to engage in during 2006-07. All Senate councils are asked to develop recommendations or memoranda of action (MOAs) as necessary. The CPFC is requested to keep the Executive Board apprised of progress, especially in connection with any MOA which it may develop, and to give ample notice of intent to bring action or reports to the full Faculty Senate.
- At the end of 2006-07, the CPFC is asked to provide a summary of its progress on the above charges to the Executive Board and suggest charges for the following year.
