In order to be permitted to major in performance, the music student must achieve a minimum grade point average of 3.25 in MUS 2000 and must be approved for this major by taking a performance qualifying examination which should normally be passed not later than the Sophomore Hearing.

*Keyboard Literature 5800 and Keyboard Pedagogy 5900 are offered every other year. See the music advisor for assistance in planning/scheduling these courses.

All music majors fulfill the Baccalaureate-level writing requirement by taking MUS 3520 NonWestern Music. This class should be taken in fall or spring of the junior or senior year as a General Education elective. Students must fulfill the Computer Literacy requirement with MUS 1140 Digital Media in the Arts.
