Position	Graduate Assistantship in Bassoon.
Responsibilities	Assist in applied studio. Perform in graduate winds program and appropriate ensembles. Other duties based on qualifications.
Qualifications	Bachelor of Music degree or equivalent. Fine performer with teaching experience preferred. Admission to a Master's degree program in music.
Award	Full and partial assistantships available. Full assistantship consists of \$11,316 salary and tuition scholarship covering 12 credits (15 credits are normally taken each academic year).
