Applications are invited for one tenure-track position at the Faculty Specialist I level in the Department of Computer Science at Western Michigan University (Kalamazoo, MI) starting July 2017.

This position includes both teaching and systems administration responsibilities. Successful candidates will be capable of teaching courses at the introductory undergraduate level and managing the department computing infrastructure. The major duties of the position include

- Installs computer software, conducts system back-ups, and ensures system performance.
- Creates and maintains student computer accounts.
- Assists students with computing questions and problems.
- Supervises, trains, and schedules staff and student employees to ensure an effective laboratory operation.
- Teaches 2 sections of low-level computer science courses in Fall and Spring semesters, and one section during Summer I.

The minimum qualifications of the position include

1. M.S. in Computer Science or a closely related field.

The desired qualifications include:

1. Experience teaching courses in Computer Science.
2. Experience in software development.
3. Supervisory experience.
4. Systems administration experience.
5. The ability to lift up to 25 lbs.

The successful candidate will be able to teach low-level computer science courses, supervise student technicians and manage computing systems. There are no research responsibilities with this position.

Applications will be accepted beginning May 1, 2017 and the position will remain open until filled. Application screening will start on June 1, 2017. The successful candidate must earn the M.S. degree by the time of employment.

The Department has 260 undergraduates, 50 M.S. students and 45 Ph.D. students.
