As communities face complex and difficult problems, many are turning to public dialogue and deliberation processes to engage citizens in collective decision making. These efforts often include group and community meetings that are carefully designed to promote thoughtful, inclusive, and rigorous discussions of controversial issues. Drawing from Dr. Black's work with the Athens City School Board's Faculties Steering Committee, this presentation highlights the discursive practices community members use to articulate conflicting values, manage disagreements, and engage the wider community in difficult dialogue about the future of the schools. It conceptualizes the role of "deliberative catalysts" who help move deliberative discourse from public meetings into other community spaces, and it offers personal reflections on the challenges of doing locally situated engaged communication scholarship about contentious issues.
