Western Michigan University Social Work Curriculum Guide

Pre-Social Work requirements:

- Students who wish to major in social work will be admitted to the pre-social work curriculum at the time of admission to the University. This status does not guarantee admission to the professional social work curriculum.
- Upon completion of 30 credit hours of college level coursework and completion, or current enrollment in SWRK 2100 (Social Work Services and Professional Roles), students may apply for admission to the School of Social Work. To submit the application, the student must have already been admitted to WMU. Application deadlines are March 15 and September 15 of each year.
- Please see the WMU social work website <u>http://wmich.edu/socialwork</u> for more details on how to apply to the program.
- Students must present a minimum 2.5 GPA to apply to the professional program. Selection is based on several criteria and is competitive, therefore 2.5 is a minimum and may not result in admission.

General education requirements (WES):

- Students must fulfill the Western Essential Studies (WES) requirements for graduation from WMU.
 Please see the <u>WES transfer guide</u>. Your community college advisor should be able to help you with this information.
- Please note, in the list below, that some of the required support courses (required of all social work majors) will also take care of some of the WES requirements.

Important notes:

- Students enrolled in the social work curriculum are required to complete a major consisting of 38 credit hours, required support courses of 22-24 credits, and 6 credits of research, totaling 66-68 hours.
- Also, part of the curriculum is a 400-hour internship at a human service agency.
- We are frequently asked whether foreign language is required of social work students. It is not required by the social work department, although it would be a good skill to have.
- Prospective transfer students should be aware that taking the SWRK 2100 class at WMU will delay
 acceptance into the social work program by at least a semester. Most community colleges do not
 offer the 2100 course, so most social work students take the course at WMU. WCCCD does not
 offer the course.
