Western Michigan University Speech Pathology and Audiology Transfer Guide

Introduction:

- ❖ The undergraduate program is pre-professional in nature and is designed to prepare students for graduate professional education in speech-language pathology, audiology, or speech sciences.
- Students interested in this major should contact the advising office within the College of Health and Human Services for an appointment with an undergraduate advisor. Because the sequencing of courses included in this major is critically important, students must seek academic advising on an early and regular basis.
- We recommend that transfer students enroll at WMU at the beginning of the first semester of the sophomore year. Those who enroll later may find that an additional period of study will be required to complete the undergraduate curriculum.

Admission requirements for the major in Speech Pathology and Audiology:

- ❖ Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 in all coursework post high school.
- ❖ Minimum grade of C (2.0) in the following courses (or their equivalents):
 - SLHS 2000 | Communication Disorders and Sciences (WMU only)
 - ENGL 1050 | Foundations in Written: Strategies, Behaviors, Success
 - BIOS 1120 | Principles of Biology or BIOS 1600 or BIOS 2110
 - PHYS 1130 & 1140 | General Physics | & Lab or CHEM 1100 & 1110 | General Chemistry | & Lab
 - STAT 1600 | Discovery With Data or STAT 3660 | Data Analysis for Biosciences
- Applicants should submit current transcripts with completed application no later than February 1 to be considered for admission to the undergraduate program for the fall semester of that year.
