We propose to add "Special Education and Elementary Education: Learning Disabilities and Emotional Impairments K-12" (SELI) and "Early Childhood Professional Education" (ECEJ) to the list of students allowed to take this course. The Special Education and Early Childhood majors were revised several years ago. The new codes (SELJ and ECEJ) need to be added to this course (ED 4500) so that students can register themselves. Right now, the Advising Office has to do manual overrides, which can delay registration and prevent students from gaining a spot in the course before it is filled.

This change was requested by the CEHD Advising Office, which noticed that Special Education students and Early Childhood Education students were not allowed to register for this required course (ED 4500). Instead, they needed manual overrides. The course restriction list needs to be updated to reflect the revised Special Education (SELJ) and Early Childhood Education (ECEJ) majors that now require ED 4500.
