EXPLORING THE IMPACT OF ETHICAL INFORMATION RESOURCES ON DECISION-MAKING

Boundary crossing concerns accounted for half of counselor professional liability claims between 2014 and 2019, which includes sexual/romantic misconduct with a client or client's family member as well as non-sexual dual relationships. The American Counseling Association 2014 Code of Ethics specifically stipulates that counselors are to use ethical decision-making models and resources to negotiate boundary crossings with clients, supervisees, and students. However, before my research there have been no studies to determine what ethical decision-making resources, if any, make an impact on a counselor's ethical decision-making processes. I will discuss my past as well as current research in progress with independently licensed counselors, counselor educators, and counselor education students in this domain.
