

## Ethics

**Definition of Ethics:** Recognize ethical issues in a variety of settings, think about how different perspectives might be applied to ethical dilemmas, and consider the ramification of alternative actions.

Holds peers accountable for community ethical standards (e.g. Bystander intervention)
<b>Perspectives</b>	Sense of ethics is externally defined rather than internally defined, cannot yet identify that their values may be different than others	Beginning to internally define their own set of ethics, is still easily influenced by external perspectives, recognizes there are different ethical perspectives	Can readily identify and articulate their personal values and sense of ethics and works to integrate multiple values and perspectives to resolve ethical dilemmas	Supports others in the development of their sense of ethics, collaborates with others to address ethical issues and integrate multiple ethical perspectives
<b>Consequences of actions</b>	Does not yet consider the consequences of their action, places blame on others or the environment/ circumstances, is unwilling or unable to determine an alternative course of action	With prompting, recognizes and acknowledges their behavior, with support is able to determine an alternative course of action	Demonstrate personal responsibility/ownership of actions, can articulate how their actions impacted others, can readily identify what would have been a better course of action	Self-identify consequences of actions, takes ownership for the consequences of decisions, recognizes the impact on others, challenging the behavior of others, understands the need to discuss behaviors related to the consequences of their actions
