Required Certification Areas:

All Special Education Students **must** complete coursework in the four certification areas listed below:

I: Elementary Education

Eligible Certifications:

- Kindergarten-5 in all subjects
- Kindergarten-8 in all subjects when teaching in a self-contained classroom—one in which the majority of instruction is provided by a single teacher

II: Learning Disabilities

Eligible Certification: Kindergarten-12 Special Education (Learning Disabilities)

III: Emotional Impairment OR Cognitive Impairment

Eligible Certification: Kindergarten-12 Special Ed (Emotional Impairment OR Cognitive Impairment)

IV: One Content Area Minor selected from the list below:

STUDENTS INTERESTED IN SPECIAL (ADAPTED) PHYSICAL EDUCATION: Undergraduates interested in teaching adapted physical education should complete either 1) a bachelor's degree in Special Education **or** 2) a bachelor's degree in Physical Education and then complete a master's degree or additional endorsement in Special (Adapted) Physical Education. Majors in Cognitive Impairments/Learning Disabilities or Emotional Impairments/Learning Disabilities

Our program consists of two years of coursework in your major and minor requirements, plus two semesters of internship. Upon completion of the program and passing the appropriate MTTC exams, you will be eligible in Michigan for credentials to teach students with learning disabilities, K-12, and either students with emotional impairments or cognitive impairments, K-12, and also elementary education, K-5. Special Education program faculty will provide academic advising for your major requirements. Advising for your minor requirements will be provided through the College of Education & Human Development Admission & Advising Office.
