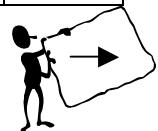
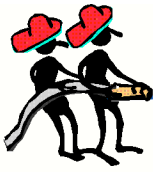




Emergency/Safety Assessment: how safe is it to be you?

Answers: #3 A fire doubles in size every 30 seconds; #4 True; #5 True – Pull the pin, Aim the nozzle at the base of the fire, Squeeze the handle, Sweep the nozzle back and forth at the base of the fire; Bonus question: smoke.
