Applications to start the music Methods sequence (3360, 3340, 3470) AND the upper level CEHD courses (LS 3050 + ES 3950) are due in the Spring of your Sophomore year. Both forms are available at wmich.edu/music/resources.

Students must complete the following prior to registration for music education methods courses or 3000-level courses in the College of Education:

 35 hours of coursework
 Overall GPA of 3.0
 Intellectual Skills requirements (if needed - ENGL 1000, MATH 1090, LS 1040)
 College-Level Writing course (ENGL 1050 or equivalent)
 College-Level Math/Quantitative Literacy course
 Societies/Cultures WES course
 ED 2500 or HSV 2250 with a "CB" or better (only HSV 2250 also fulfills Gen Ed/WES requirement)
 Criminal background check through <u>castlebranch.com</u> . This is recommended during fall of the sophomore year; it expires after one year.
 When all of the above are completed, submit an application to the College of Education and Human Development Advising Office (2421 Sangren Hall). Applications are accepted on a rolling basis, but must be submitted prior to the fall semester when you wish to begin methods.
 Complete the music core in theory/history/aural skills and conducting (MUS 2150); all must be completed with a "C" or better, and you must have at least a 2.5 GPA in theory/aural skills/history classes:
Basic Music 1600, 1610, 2600, 2610 Aural Skills 1620, 1630, 2590 Music History 2700, 2710
 Have no grade of less than "C" in Applied Music and successfully complete the Sophomore Hearing.
 Submit an application to the music education area during the Spring semester prior to when you wish to begin methods. Applications are available in the Music Advising Office and through wmich.edu/music/resources.
