There are three changes: (1) change the generic description and notes to be more specific; (2) change the hours that a given student could enrolled in two to 12; and (3) add the full-time exemption to this course.

- (1) The current course description is at least two decades old, and refers to something (e.g., the graduate college section) that no longer exists. This revision simply updates the course description and notes.
- (2) Some students in our program need to take three credits of EDLD 7120, but their field experience work may be spread out over a year or more. The credit hours are therefore being changed to allow a given student to enroll for just one of these credits during a given semester.
- (3) Graduate students may only need to take one credit per semester as they complete their final graduate program requirements such as these field experience credits, but may be required to start repaying loans unless they are enrolled full-time. Adding the full-time exemption to this course means a student could be enrolled only in these credits and still be eligible for loan deferment.
