SAMUEL WELLS is a composer, performer, and arranger based in Bloomington, Indiana. As an advocate for new and exciting music, he actively commissions and performs contemporary works for trumpet.

As a soloist, Wells has performed throughout the United States, as well as in Canada and France. He has appeared at several universities as a guest artist and performer. His compositions have been presented at the Chosen Vale International Trumpet Seminar, Electronic Music Midwest, Electroacoustic Barn Dance, SEAMUS festivals, KcEMA's 2011 & 2013 concert seasons, and the 2014 Understanding Visual Music conference in Buenos Aires.

Wells has degrees in both performance and composition at the University of Missouri-Kansas City, where he studied composition with James Mobberley, Paul Rudy, Chen Yi and Zhou Long, and trumpet with Keith Benjamin. He is currently attending Indiana University for graduate degrees in Trumpet and Computer Music Composition, and studies with John Rommel, Jeffery Hass, John Gibson, Aaron Travers, and Sven-David Sandström. Wells serves as the Assistant Director of the IU New Music Ensemble.
