This agreement shall commence as of April 17, 2023. This program agreement shall abide by all language of the Institutional Agreement between Kellogg Community College and Western Michigan University.

Candidates for a degree or certificate from Kellogg Community College must meet specific requirements including the completion of a minimum of sixty (60) credits hours with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher.
