

**WMU Faculty Senate
Extended University Programs Council (EUPC)
Charges for 2015-2016**

Matthew Mingus will serve as the Faculty Senate Executive Board representative on EUPC

In addition to its specific responsibilities listed in the Extended University Programs Council's role statement and the work of subcommittees if such exist, the Faculty Senate Executive Board charges the EUPC to consider, as a committee of the whole or through the appropriate subcommittee or task force, the following issues:

1. Review curricula and programs that EUP offers and EUP processes and procedures to ensure the University is efficient and effective in responding to external opportunities.
2. Develop recommendations for access and support services offered to students to maximize the inclusion of our diverse student population.
3. Explore, evaluate and provide input competency based learning models for EUP programming, keeping in mind the diverse substantive and pedagogical approaches of WMU faculty.
4. Evaluate and provide input on alternative and innovative learning programs such as middle colleges and on-line dual enrolment.
5. Actively collaborate with the CPFC Subcommittee to Assess Incentive-Based Budget Models toward the goal of increasing departmental incentives to continue offering courses at off-campus sites.
6. Address any continuing or outstanding issues or initiatives as deemed necessary by the council. To the extent possible conclude any outstanding initiative by producing a memorandum of action, report or resolution.

NOTE: The EUPC will seek information from the Office of Extended University Programs to maintain communications with that office on issues directly related to it. The EUPC is expected to keep the Faculty Senate Executive Board apprised of progress, especially in connection with any MOA it may develop and to give advance notice of any action the EUPC seeks to place on the Senate agenda, including the final text of any proposed MOA, report or resolution. The Executive Board should also be notified of substantive procedural issues addressed by the EUPC.

The EUPC chairperson shall provide a written summary of the council's progress for the year; list the above charges noting each items progress and current status; any other activities undertaken; and draft charges for the 2016-17 academic year, no later than June 30, 2016.
