Remarks by John Dunn, WMU President

- -American Council of Education College President's meeting in Washington, DC. Key topic of interest was the conversation about freedom of expression on college campuses. Dr. Dunn cited this study (http://www.knightfoundation.org/articles/lets-talk-about-free-speech), about which he noted the group failed to move the conversation around forward in any substantive way.
- -Enrollment is down 1.3% this fall, but appears not to impact budget as much as anticipated
- -We had an improved yield rate this fall
- -Our first-year to second-year retention rate is quickly approaching our targeted 80%
- -This year's first-year class had more females than males
- -Athletics

- A) WMU has 16 Division I sports, of which 10 are women's sports (for Title IX balance)
- B) WMU participates in two conferences, the MAC (since 1948) and NCHC (hockey)
- C) total athletics expenditures for 2015 were \$27.5m, of which \$24m comes from the general fund; this is split into (in)direct support
- D) Direct support (\$19m) includes \$9.9m in scholarships, which WMU gives to athletics, then athletics gives right back
- E) Indirect support (\$5.3m) includes things like facilities management, accounting services, information technology, security, utilities, and debt service on athletics facilities
- F) Moving down to Division II is impractical due to loss of monies from NCAA (~\$1.5m) and the MAC as well as reduced ticket revenue and donations. The upside to such a move could be fewer scholarships and less spending on facilities management (which would not be realized for several years) and debt services (we have the structures, so they need to be paid for).
