COMMITTEE CHARGES

1. Identify challenges and propose potential solutions associated with the implementation of, and transition to, the revised general education curriculum.
2. Develop a recommended revised general education WMU Essential Studies draft policy to reflect the revised general education curriculum and associated processes during the fall 2017 semester for final approval at the April 2018 Faculty Senate meeting.
3. Develop and submit a time-bound recommended action plan for the implementation and short- and long-term assessment of the revised general education curriculum by the final meeting of the 2017-18 Faculty Senate.
4. Develop a process to allow all colleges and units to propose new or existing courses for the revised general education curriculum. Recommend that the Faculty Senate Executive Board create a standing subcommittee that reports directly to the Undergraduate Studies Council and is responsible for the review and approval of all proposed courses in the revised general education curriculum.
5. Report to the Faculty Senate Executive Board and the Faculty Senate as requested during the 2016-17 and 2017-18 academic years.
