Open Educational Resources

The faculty senate fully supports and encourages WMU faculty to seek and consider, wherever possible, adopting high quality, low cost or no cost, accessible open textbooks and other open educational resources (OER), in order to reduce student textbook costs.

The high and rising costs of commercial textbooks and course materials have resulted in many students unable to purchase required materials. Research has indicated a strong correlation between the high cost of textbooks and a decline in student academic success, particularly with Pell Grant eligible students. Open textbooks and other OER, when selected by faculty for

their courses, can offer appropriate, accessible, and no or low-cost alternatives to commercial textbooks. Since OER are online, they work well with online courses.

Open educational resources (OER) are educational materials that reside in the public domain or have been released under an open license. This permits them to be freely used, changed and shared with others. OER includes everything from images and videos to textbooks and course curriculums. This provides greater flexibility for faculty who may desire to adopt, modify, and enrich content in ways not possible with commercially produced and licensed materials.
