

Our Services

All counseling sessions at CCPS are audio and digitally recorded to evaluate the student counselor's skills and to maximize the services clients receive. Client information is confidential at CCPS. All recordings of sessions are securely stored, deidentified, and deleted/destroyed at the end of each semester.

CCPS counselors offer help navigating:

- Feelings of stress, depression, anxiety, loneliness, or guilt
- Adjustments and life transitions
- Grief/Loss
- Relationships (e.g., family, friends, partners, roommates).
- Trauma
- Romantic or sexual concerns
- Identity development
- Self-esteem concerns
- Perfectionism

Group Counseling – Doctoral student led support groups provide an opportunity for participants to learn new skills, receive support, and share information and resources. Topics offered range from wellness, stress reduction, and emotional regulation.

Psychological Testing – CCPS Grand Rapids offer Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD) and Learning Disorder testing. Additional testing, such as mood and personality testing, may be offered as well.

Affordable fees

As a nonprofit agency, fees at the CCPS are based on a sliding scale. Counseling services are offered at no cost to current WMU students. Fees for testing are market competitive. Call CCPS for more information.





Career Counseling

CCPS career counselors provide free career counseling to students, faculty, and staff at Western Michigan University. Career counseling can help individuals better understand their personality, interests, values, and skills so that they can make knowledgeable decisions while navigating their career.

Students may also opt to take the IMPACTeX Navigator career assessment for a \$20 fee.
