The application for the NEH Institute “Law and Culture in Medieval England” must be completed in a single online session. Please make sure that you have assembled the necessary documents for upload in one of the allowed formats and that you are prepared to supply the information required for the questionnaire.

Materials to upload:

- **Curriculum vitae.** Your curriculum vitae must include the names and email addresses of two professional references. You should tell your references that they may be contacted early in March to submit their letters of recommendation. (doc, docx, or pdf accepted)
- **Application essay.** Note that the **most important part of the application** is the essay of no more than four double-spaced pages. This essay should include your reasons for applying to the institute; your relevant personal and academic information; your qualifications to do the work of the institute and contribute to it; and what you hope to accomplish. (doc, docx, or pdf accepted)
