

- Frogs and Toads of Kleinstuck Preserve



BULL FROG

- 3-8 inches. Biggest frog.
- No ridges on sides.
- Starts singing in June.
- Voice: Loud “RRRUMMM”.



AMERICAN TOAD

- 2-4 inches.
- Tough “warty” skin.
- Starts singing by the end of April or mid-May.
- Voice: Long musical trill.



GREEN FROG

- 2.5-4 inches.
- Brown to green with ridge down sides.
- Starts singing by mid-May.
- Voice: Short and loud “banjo” twang.



WOOD FROG

- 2-2.5 inches.
- Brown frog with black mask.
- Starts singing by the end of March.
- Voice: Small quacking call, groups sound like “chuckling”.



GRAY TREEFROG

- 1.5-2 inches.
- Changes color from gray to green.
- Starts singing by the end of April.
- Voice: Short musical trill. Calls from trees summer and fall too.



CHORUS FROG

- 1-1.5 inches.
- Small frog with dark stripes and black mask.
- Often first to sing. Starts singing in March.
- Voice: Raspy rising trill “creeeek”, like strumming teeth on a comb.



SPRING PEEPER

- 1-1.5 inches.
- Small tan frog with dark “X” on the back.
- Starts singing by the end of March.
- Voice: Loud “PEEP”. Groups can be heard from far away. They can drown out all other frog calls.
