The completion of the general dining room and sleeping quarters at the colony farm, just finished, was celebrated last night by a dance. All the employes of the institution were invited and many availed themselves of the privilege. Special cars took the crowd from the main building to the end of the street, car tracks, where they were met by members of the colony farm with teams and driven to the colony farm.

One of the features of the new building is the underground tunnel that has been built. During the stormy days of winter or of inclement weather in the summer, the patients will not be compelled to buffet with the elements in going from the cottages to the dining room. The tunnel has been so built that it connects with two of the cottages and will soon be connected with the third. It is illuminated with electric lights and the patients are protected from wintry winds and snow in their passage from the cottages to the dining room.

Aside from the kitchen, which is connected with the general hospital, the sleeping quarters of the nurses and employes will also be located in the building. The structure is of brick and has commodious quarters for the dining room and the sleeping apartments.
