Dr. Evan Larson (Department of Environmental Sciences and Society, University of Wisconsin – Platteville) is a biogeographer and ecological historian who uses tree rings to uncover histories of Midwestern forests, including patterns of climate, disturbance, and landscape change. His research, funded by the National Science Foundation, fuses innovative scientific methods and intercultural knowledge-building with family storytelling. He works with sovereign tribes in Minnesota to reintroduce cultural fire practices to red pine forests, which are in decline because of forced Indian removal, subsequent settler and policy histories of fire exclusion, and today's climate crisis. These collaborations center ancestral Anishinaabe fire practices for the future, reciprocal well-being of forests and Native communities.
