Session Descriptions

Academic Advising at WMU – An academic advisor will give a general overview of how advising works at Western Michigan University as well as information regarding goWMU and the pre-audit/graduation application.

Bronco Express & Accounts Receivable – A representative from Bronco Express will explain the financial aid process, discuss financing options, talk about the billing and payment process, and answer your questions.

Bronco Socials – Come to the Bronco Social room to meet other incoming students and current students. Get answers to some of your questions in this laid-back environment.

Browsing Tables – This is your chance to learn a little more about some of the many programs and services available to students at WMU. You can even pick up some cool swag!

Career and Student Employment Services & WMU Signature – Learn about full-time, part-time and internship opportunities on and off campus. This session will explain WMU's web-based employment service – Handshake – and the resources for career planning that are available throughout the academic year. You will also learn about this student engagement program for students to reflect on their out-of-class learning experiences, and to explore and identify a passion that will be reflected on their WMU diploma.

Global Engagement & Study Abroad – Join the Global Engagement Program! In Year One: "Global Learning for All," you will take courses with other freshmen from around the University to learn about the world, interact with peers abroad and study abroad virtually.
