ADMISSIONS INFORMATION

HESA welcomes full-and part-time applicants and students of all majors to complete an $application, which \ requires \ official \ transcripts, resume, written \ statement, and \ recommendation$ forms, with one letter of recommendation encouraged.

- An overall GPA of at least 3.0 in the last two years of undergraduate work is required.
- GRE scores are not required
- Priority application deadline is January 15 in order to start the following fall
- If admitted by February 1 you are given the opportunity to participate in HESA Info & Interview Days, which connects you to WMU departments hiring graduate assistants (GA)
