Procedural Items

Acceptance of the Agenda
Approval of Minutes from the 8 April Meeting

- Tracy DeMars, Teaching, Learning and Educational Studies, from the College of Education and Human Development, replaces Marcia Fetters on COGE.

Nick Gauthier, academic advisor, Arts and Sciences, was welcomed as a

substitute for Kevin Knutson at this meeting.

Action/Discussion Items

2013-14 Re-Approval of Courses in Proficiency 1, College-Level Writing and Proficiency 2, Baccalaureate-Level Writing

Geiser noted approximately ninety courses are up for COGE re-approval in 2013-14. He will review the re-approval process with the committee after the submission deadline later in the fall semester.

Review of Curriculum Proposals with Only Procedural Changes

A discussion on possibly allowing the COGE chair or vice chair to approve curriculum proposals when only procedural changes - with no change to the course curriculum - are requested was initiated. Members mentioned specific situations (such as the request to change a course title only) when that might be appropriate but came to no final decision. Reinhold offered to create a list of situations when that may be appropriate. It was agreed to continue the discussion at the next meeting.

Journalism as a prerequisite from JRN 3100 (Proficiency 2,
Baccalaureate-Level Writing)

Approval of JRN 3100 moved by Ferrin, seconded by Falan. Motion carried with one abstention.

3. **[CHHS 002-13] HOL 2701, Resiliency Training for Leaders** – new course, requests approval in Area VIII: Health and Well-Being.

- a) The intent of the curriculum proposal is unclear to COGE. Does the program wish to add HOL 2701 as a new course, not as a replacement for HOL 2811?
- b) Please clarify response to #10. If not a response to assessment outcomes, what is this change in response to?
- 4. [CAS 1115] GEOS 2500, Planetary Geology existing course in Area VI Natural Science with Laboratory, requests changing course level from 2000-level to 1000-level.

Approval of GEOS 2500 moved by Aravamuthan, seconded by Ferrin. Motion carried.

5. **[CAS 1184] REL 2000, Introduction to the Study of Religion** – existing course, requests title change to REL 2000 Thinking about Religion; addition of ENG 1050 or equivalent as a prerequisite; approval as general education course in *Proficiency 4a, Advanced Writing*.

[Correction noted: REL 2000 was listed on the agenda as requesting approval as a general education course in Proficiency 2, Baccalaureate-Level Writing, instead of Proficiency 4a, Advanced Writing.]

b) Please clarify and expand on the intent of the response to #11. COGE is concerned, as any comparable general education courses should be transferable from community colleges that WMU has agreements with.
