## "Do Fast Women Really Need Engineers?"

Tuesday, February 20th, 2024 at WMU's Fetzer Center



Louise A. Noeth, aka "Landspeed Louise," founded LandSpeed Productions in California in 1984, offering creative writing, photography, design and public relations. She authored the leading historical reference book, Bonneville Salt Flats, in print for 11 years through seven printings and consults for the film and television industries on extreme speed.

Amateur motorsports enthusiasts have used Utah's Bonneville Salt Flats as a speed laboratory for more than a century. With their handcrafted cars, trucks and motorcycles, thousands of men *and* women have hosted pageants of power each summer since 1949. Every single one came looking for the answer to the same question: "How fast will to go?" The decades of effort have made them the fastest people on earth reaching speeds of more than 500 mph. People who race on the salt flats become a family bound together by speed – a powerful force that erases ethnic, economic, political, and religious barriers: They are land speed racers.

The evening presentation dumps the dudes to shine a spectacular spotlight on how some 350 women

(ages 16 to 80) designed, built and/or set more than 1,000 land speed records. Please be advised that these speed records were enhanced by lipstick and nail polish.
