WMU's nationally accredited counseling psychology program is offered at the masters and doctoral levels. Additionally, a certificate in counseling psychology is also available to individuals who already have a master's degree and are seeking to obtain state of Michigan licensure as a Temporary Limited License Psychologist (TLLP)/Limited License Psychologist (LLP) in Michigan.

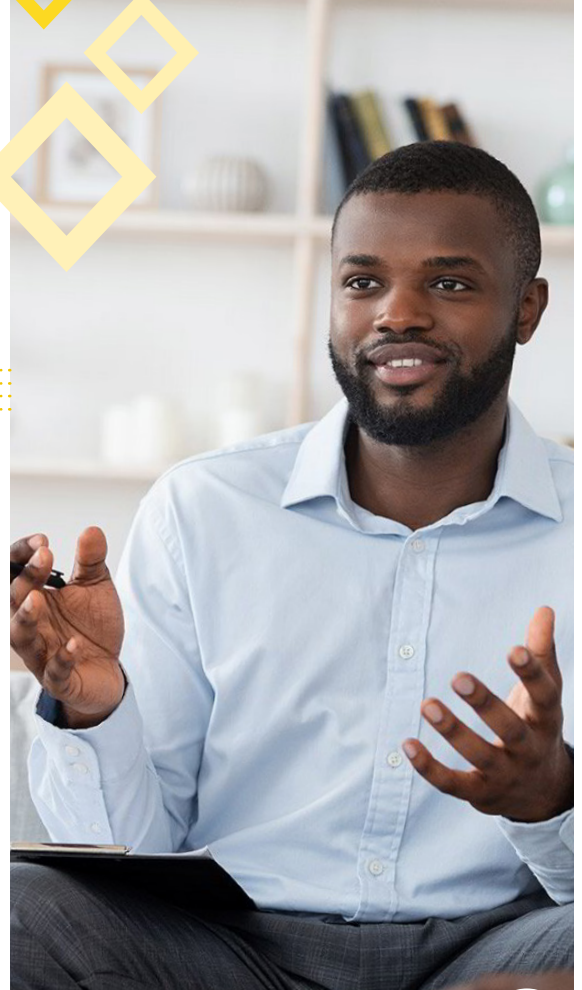
Application Deadlines:

DOCTORAL PROGRAM

Guided by the philosophy that theory, research, and practice are interdependent and complementary, courses and practical experiences are shaped to ensure professional competency in all three dimensions and to facilitate their integration. Graduates meet curriculum requirements for licensure as a psychologist in Michigan and, because the program is APA accredited, may meet curricular requirements for licensing in other states. The program prepares counseling psychologists with the skills to work successfully with diverse populations.
