

MASTER OF ARTS

DOCTORAL PROGRAM

This 61 credit hour doctoral program provides advanced-level preparation for students and is not intended to meet the educational requirements of those who seek to be licensed psychologists. Students are required to demonstrate professional competencies through supervised experiences. These experiences include research, teaching and counseling. Entry to this program assumes that applicants have or are about to complete their master's degree in counseling or a closely related field.
