Western Michigan University Dietetics Curriculum Guide

Pre-dietetics requirements:

- Students are admitted to the Pre-dietetics program for the first two years, and most apply for admission to the major (years 3 and 4) at the end of the second semester of the sophomore year.
- The application deadline is May 15 of each academic year, and must include the Didactic Program of Dietetics (DPD) form, a letter of application, a non-refundable \$20 application fee, and official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended.
- Minimum admission requirements:
 - Attainment of a cumulative 3.0 GPA;
 - Completion of a letter of application stating reasons for selecting dietetics as a career, and short- and long-term professional goals;
 - Completion of the following pre-dietetics courses:

*Students must have completed or be enrolled in the courses with asterisks, and have a minimum 3.0 GPA at the time of application. This program requires a 2.0 (C) or higher in all courses.

- Admission to the last three semesters of the program is determined by a selection committee.
