Multicultural Affairs for Students (MAS)



- College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP)
 - Provides academic and financial support to assist migrant and seasonal farmworkers or their children in completing their degree.
- Kalamazoo Promise Scholars Program
 - Provides academic, social, and financial literacy support for students attending WMU who are recipients of the Kalamazoo Promise Scholarship.
- Martin Luther King Jr. (MLK) Student Scholars Academy
 - MLK Academy participants are recipients of the MLK G.O.L.D. Scholarship.
 - Includes four tiers to provide services and support to students from their first year through graduation.
- Mentoring for Success Program
 - Provides 24/7 online tutoring service, academic mentoring, and skill-building workshops to undergraduate students.





Disability Services for Students (DSS)

Students that had accommodations in high school (504 or IEP) or students that need accommodations in College should connect with DSS to set up accommodations at WMU. DSS can provide accommodations for students that identify with the following:

- ADHD
- Autism Spectrum Disorder
- Mental Health (e.g. Anxiety, Depression)
- Medical Conditions (e.g. Migraines, Allergies, Seizures)
- Deaf/Hard of Hearing
- Blind/Low Vision
- Mobility
- Temporary



Supplemental Tools:

- Glean A personalized study tool available to DSS Students at no cost
- Aira A live, human-to-human professional assistance service for people who are blind or have low vision, also free of cost to anyone on WMU campus
