DISCUSSION / INFORMATION ITEMS Homepages Replacement – Bruce Paananen

- Homepages will no longer display student, alumni, and staff webpages by the end of this year and 90 days will be given to remove all files following its discontinuation. Faculty and administrative faculty are excluded from the deletion of Homepages.
- The Office of Information Technology Web Applications team is looking for an alternative commercial software to Homepages; Google Sites and Open Scholar were discussed.
- Simpson suggested that Paananen and Wolf speak in front of the Faculty Senate to clarify the Homepages replacement. Wolf agreed to do an outreach to concerned faculty.
- A motion was made by Simpson, seconded by Tasko, to postpone the vote for the Homepages replacement until November. Motion carried.

NextGen/Microsoft Office 365 - Adam Newsted

- Newsted presented a NextGen Collaboration Program roadmap, highlighting "The Gold" section; discussion was held. A handout was provided.
- Simpson suggested that Newsted come back for a report update in the spring; Wolf agreed.
